Children in 9 countries joined forces again and collected

2.313.645 Green Footprints in 2020

2.967.976 Green Footprints in 2021

Corona couldn't stop them from acting for our climate now!

ZOOM-kids from Austria, Belarus, Germany, Hungary, Italy, Luxembourg, Netherlands, North Macedonia, and Sweden earned these footprints by using climate-friendly means of transport for their daily journeys to school or kindergarten, eating local, organic food and using energy sustainably.

ZOOM-Kids are aware that they need to convince not only the politicians at the UN Climate Conference but all adults to do their utmost to make climate protection a real priority not only in speeches but above all in action.

The children emphasise that not only their children but already they themselves will have to pay dearly in the future if today's weak regulations aren't strengthened NOW!

This year's report is special in several ways: Due to the Pandemic there was no handover of Green Footprints in 2020, so for the first time the report includes the results of two years activity.

Covid-19 has restricted the little climate activists to do their yearly climate activity week as usual. But their enthusiasm and courage for the saving the climate was unbroken!

The kids and their institutions got extra creative and developed many new ways of climate-friendly action and showed that they are still there and don't stop to care about future!

Instead of walking to school,
kids collected footprints by walking their dogs during the lockdown.

Canceled St. Martin's Day parades
were replaced by going individually – but still in a joint effort.

In place of handcrafting Christmas decoration with their classmates,
they made extraordinary Wishprints with their families.

And more than ever before, the kids just keep on collecting Green Footprints, even though they know that their results will not be shown at the climate conference.

Once again, the little ones are the better role models and show the big ones that climate protection can only succeed if we are all prepared to do our best at all times - and not just to shine at the climate conference.

Due to Corona, handovers of the Green Footprints results to local politicians often could not take place or could only happen with very few participants.

So altogether for COP 26 there are 524.099 Klimameilen collected by 25.764 children

The Kids on the move Campaign is being held the 19th time in Austria, this means in 2022 it's time to celebrate 20 years "Klimameilen" – the planning already started.

The poster used for the presentation of the Austrian result to the Minister came from pupils of the VS Perchtoldsdorf, who have been participating in the campaign for years.
In addition the children send wishes to the politicians like less planes, less CO2 emissions.

2020 waren Kinder aus 129 Schulen dabei und sammelten insgesamt 271.400 Klimameilen/Green Footprints
2021 sammelten Kinder aus 120 Schulen 252.699 Klimameilen

Für COP 26 sind es also insgesamt 524.099 Klimameilen gesammelt von 25.764 Kindern

Die Klimameilen-Kampagne fand in Österreich zum 19. Mal statt. 2022 feiern wir 20 Jahre Klimameilen – die Planungen dafür laufen bereits.

Belarus




In 2021 there were 25 kindergartens and schools from 9 Belarusian municipalities to join the ZOOM community. As of 1 November, 9 of them were not done with their Climate Action Weeks so 283 children from 5 to 12 years old have yet collected a total of 3,948 Green Footprints for COP 26

Children from the towns and districts of Karma, Garadok, Ashmiany, Pruzhany, Kobrin, Kalinkavichy, and Navapolatsk collected green and blue footprints for several weeks. Along the way they discussed concrete ideas and activities on sustainable mobility and climate protection. Thanks to Interakcia Foundation, the campaign's coordinator in Belarus, the materials could be adopted and translated into Russian this year.



The little Climate activists wrote poems, created posters, joined the symbolic Climate Journey to learn about climate challenges on all continents, and they posted their achievements on social media.



The children's ideas on how to combat climate change are to plant trees, to save energy and water at home, to re-use and share things instead of throwing them away, and much more!

The 4-graders from the Khoreva village in the Pruzhany district start their own action by making a climate protection calendar for 2022 and want to give it to all children in their school as a special gift for the New Year!

Беларусь

В этом году к участникам кампании ZOOM присоединились 25 школ и детских садов из 9 городов и районов Беларуси. К концу октября 16 из них уже отчитались о своих результатах, а 9 пока не закончили проведение своих Недель климата. На данный момент в акции приняли участие уже **283 девочки и мальчика в возрасте от 5 до 12 лет: вместе они собрали целых 3,948 зелёных следов.**

В этом году зелёные и голубые следы собирали дети из деревень и городов Кормянского, Ошмянского, Пружанского, Кобринского, Городокского, Калинковичского и Новополоцкого районов. В течение этого времени они не только передвигались эко-дружественным способом, но и обсуждали конкретные идеи и мероприятия по устойчивой мобильности и защите климата. В этом им помогали материалы кампании – их в этом году дополнил и перевёл на русский язык координатор кампании в Беларуси – фонд «Интеракция».



В течение этих нескольких недель дети сочиняли стихи о климате, рисовали плакаты, отправлялись в «Климатическое путешествие» и узнавали о том, какие проблемы испытывает наша планета из-за изменения климата, а ещё снимали видео и делали посты о своих достижениях в социальных сетях.



Ребята обсуждали много отличных идей, как можно бороться с изменением климата: сажать деревья и кустарники, экономить энергию и воду дома и в школе, делать из старых вещей новые нужные вещи и подарки, и ещё много всего! А ещё у ребят появились свои собственные креативные идеи, как рассказывать другим об изменении климата. Например, ученицы и ученики 4 класса Хоревской средней школы Пружанского района решили создать календарь на 2022 год с фотографиями кампании и советами по защите климата. Этот календарь они собираются подарить на Новый год всем, кто учится в школе!

Quite some institutions organized clean ups all around their facilities. Others planted their own vegetables or harvested nearby apple trees to make apple juice and chips. Some mixed butter with self-cropped herbs, created food faces and held harvest festivals on climate-friendly food.

The kindergartens and schools prepared reports on their ideas for Climate Activity Weeks to also inspire their parents and families.

Or they made flyer and short videos to share with other children what they had learned about greenhouse gases and climate change.

Others generated reusable collecting systems like stamps, green coloured stones or marbles to make their activity weeks even more sustainable.

2020 waren Kinder aus 483 Einrichtungen dabei und sammelten insgesamt 1.062.022 Klimameilen/Green Footprints
2021 meldeten Kinder aus 667 Einrichtungen 1.487.698 Klimameilen

Für COP 26 sind es also insgesamt 2.548.505 Klimameilen gesammelt von 183.830 Kindern

Auch wenn einige Einrichtungen ihre Sammelwochen aufgrund der Pandemie mehrfach verschieben oder gar absagen mussten, fanden die Kinder, ihre Erzieher*innen und Lehrer*innen viele neue Wege, um Meilen zu sammeln:

Kampagnenbanner sind kurzerhand in kleine Teile zerteilt worden, um sie so coronakonform alleine zuhause bemalen zu können.

Erstmals wurde im November und Dezember gesammelt, als Ersatz für abgesagte Martinsumzüge und ausgefallenes Weihnachtsbasteln.

Und während des Lockdowns zählten eben nicht die üblichen Schulwege, sondern die täglichen Gassigänge mit dem Hund auf das Meilenkonto.

Etliche Einrichtungen organisierten Müllsammelaktionen. Andere pflanzten ihr eigenes Gemüse an und ernteten Äpfel für Apfelsaft und -chips. Manche machten Kräuterbutter mit selbst gesammelten Kräutern, legten Brotgesichter oder feierten Erntedank, um zu entdecken was sie Leckeres aus regionalen und saisonalen Lebensmitteln machen können.

Die Kindergärten und Schulen dokumentierten ihre Klima-Aktionswochen ausdrucksvooll auf Plakaten und in Berichten und nutzten diese, um auch die Eltern und Großeltern mit einzubinden.

Die Kinder erstellten im Unterricht eigene Infoblätter und kurze Videos, mit denen sie ihr Wissen zu Treibhausgasen und Klimawandel den anderen Schüler*innen weitergaben.

Immer mehr Einrichtungen nutzen wieder verwendbare Sammelsysteme wie Stempel oder Murmeln. Auch selbstgesammelte Steine wurden bemalt, die – bis zur nächsten Aktionswoche als Spielsteine verwendet – die Kinder immer wieder daran erinnern, sich klimafreundlich zu verhalten.

In 2020 children and teachers from 68 schools and kindergartens participated and collected 246,342 Zöld Mérföld /Green Footprints
In 2021 children from 96 institutions joined in and gathered another 298,625 Zöld Mérföld
Thus 39,753 Hungarian participants sent 544,967 Zöld Mérföld to COP 26

A lot of schools from all over Hungary were participating in the „ZOOM – Kids on the Move for Climate Action”, organized by Climate Alliance Hungary.

In 2021 the campaign focused on the Earth as soil and as a planet - the tasks were related to this theme. Children set up compost bins in several schools and realized compost festival.

Matching the slogan "There is only one Earth!,, pupils wrote poems, designed posters and pictures using the colours of the earth. They also created collages from seeds, stones and soil.

In many institutions, the schoolyards were greened up, and the pupils planted trees and bushes and set up new gardens with perennials.

Meat-free days were organised in the canteens, and pupils participated in cooking clubs to enjoy seasonal vegetables and fruits and to exchanged recipes.

As part of the campaign in 2021, institutions could join the World Climate March initiative by organising a 1.5 km walk for children, marked by self-made posters on climate action.

Magyarország

Mozdulj a klímáért! 2020-2021

2020-ban 68 iskola 15,999 diákja és 1,431 tanára vett részt a kampányban, ahol összesen 246,342 zöld mérköldet gyűjtöttek össze. A 2021-es kampányhoz 96 oktatási intézmény 20,145 diákja és 2,178 pedagógusa csatlakozott, 298,625 zöld mérköldet gyűjtve. Így a magyar résztvevők összesen **544.967 zöld mérköldet** küldhettek el a COP26 találkozóra.

Továbbra is számos csatlakozót vonz az ország minden tájáról a Magyarországi Éghajlatvédelmi Szövetség és a Reflex Környezetvédelő Egyesület „Mozdulj a klímáért!” kampánya. A környezettudatos utazásokon túl más feladatok közül is választhatnak a résztvevők.

A 2021- es kampány célkeresztjében a Föld állt - mint talaj és mint bolygó - a feladatok ehhez a témahez kapcsolódtak. A gyerekek több iskolában komposztkereteket készítettek és szerveztek komposztünnepeket. Élőképeken jelenítették meg éghajlatvédelmi üzeneteiket.

Az iskolai menzán húsmentes napokat tartottak, és a diákok főzőklubb keretében szezonális zöldségekből közösen készített ételeket kóstoltak; sőt receptet is cserélhettek egymással. Számos helyen zöldülték az iskolaudvarok, a gyerekek fákat és évelő növényeket ültettek, kertet rendeztek. „Csak egy Földünk van!” címmel verseteket, indulókat írtak illetve a földszínekkel használva plakátokat, képeket készítettek. Magokból, kövekből, földből összeállított montázsképek is születtek.

A kampány részeként 2021-ben az intézmények csatlakozhattak a World Climate March kezdeményezéséhez: 1,5 km hosszú gyaloglást szervezhettek a gyerekeknek, akik plakátokat is készítettek ez alkalomból.



The Green Footprint campaign is carried out in Luxembourg every two years, so in 2021 it was once again time for "*Op Kannerféiss duerch d'Welt*" ('Around the world on children's feet'). Since Corona did not make it easy for the schools to participate, the number of returns was smaller than usually, but the result was nonetheless impressive!

This is mainly due to schools like the Berdorf-Ecole fond. , collecting an astonishing 1,018 Greng Meilen/Green Footprints with only 20 little climate protectors. Also the children of the Belair Gaston Diderich School were participating diligently and together collected 3,048 Greng Meilen. Their brightly coloured Wishprints to the Politicians were stringed together to form a long chain so they do not loose each other on their long journey to Glasgow.

Insgesamt waren für dieses Jahr
1.807 Kinder aus 24 Schulen gemeldet
Der Luxemburger Meilenzähler für die COP
steht auf 52.555 Gréng Meilen

Alle zwei Jahre beteiligt sich Luxembourg an der Kindermeilen-Kampagne und so hieß es dort 2021 wieder 'Op Kannerféiss duerch d'Welt'.

Da Corona es manch angemeldeter Schule nicht leicht machte sich zu beteiligen, war die Anzahl der Rückläufe etwas geringer als sonst, aber das Ergebnis kann sich trotzdem sehen lassen!

Dies liegt vor allem an Schulen wie der **Berdorf-Ecole fond.**, die mit 20 kleinen Klimaschützer*innen an der Kindermeilen- Kampagne teilgenommen und erstaunliche 1.018 Greng Meilen gesammelt hat.

Auch die Kinder der **Belair Gaston Diderich Schule** waren fleißig mit von der Partie und sammelten gemeinsam 3.048 Greng Meilen. Ihre knallebunten Politikerfüße fädelten sie zu einer langen Kette auf, damit sie sich auf dem weiten Weg nach Glasgow nicht verlieren.

In der **Schoul Käerch** haben die Kinder mit ihren Wunschfüßen zwei wunderschöne Herzen geformt, um die Dringlichkeit ihrer Forderungen zu betonen.

Auf den an die Klimapolitiker in Glasgow gerichteten Wunschfüßen stehen Forderungen wie:

- ❖ Ich wünsche mir, dass nur noch umweltfreundlicher Strom produziert wird.
- ❖ Ich wünsche mir, dass weniger Plastik benutzt wird.
- ❖ Viel wurde schon getan, aber es könnte noch besser sein.

Netherlands



In 2020 children from 34 schools took part and together collected a total of 40,562 Groene Voetstappen /Green Footprints
In 2021 children from 38 schools gathered another 61,171 Groene Voetstappen

So altogether for COP 26 there are 101,733 Groene Voetstappen collected by 20.184 children

In the Netherlands, where the Green Footprints Campaign is coordinated by *Klimaatverbond Nederland* and *Vereniging GDO*, pupils from all over the land walked and rode their bicycles, scooters, or skateboards along for one week at the end of September.

Adding up the results of both years the children's daily journeys "circumnavigated" them over 2,5 times climate friendly around the world.

The municipality of Breda made a special deal with the kids in 2021: for each 2,500 Groene Voetstappen collected by the children, the municipality donates a bicycle to a family that cannot afford one.

By the end of the campaign, the children from the 14 participating schools in Breda managed to achieve nine bicycles with their number of footprints. The municipality was so impressed by the kids efforts that they doubled the number and thus 18 bicycles could be provided.

Kinderklimaattop 2021

On April 15, the first-ever national **Children's Climate Agreement** was signed during the Kinderklimaattop in the municipality of Velsen. Children all over the Netherlands were able to attend live and vote on the agreements they think are most important to prevent further climate change, to adapt to a changing climate, and in addition are most fair for all people in the world. The Children's Climate Agreement, also called the "Treaty of Velsen", was presented to Ed Nijpels, chairman of the Climate Agreement Progress Consultation.

These are the three most important agreements of the '**Nationale Kinderklimaataktiekkoord**'

- ❖ Raise the dunes and reinforce the dykes.
- ❖ Eat less meat
- ❖ One tree out, two in return

Nederland

In 2020 deden zo'n 7.100 kinderen verspreid over 34 basisscholen mee aan Groene Voetstappen. Samen verzamelden zij 40.562 Groene Voetstappen. In 2021 deden er ruim 11.000 kinderen mee verspreid over 38 basisscholen. Met elkaar verzamelden zij 61.171 Groene Voetstappen samen.

Tot aan COP 26 werden er dus in totaal 101.733 Groene Voetstappen verzameld

In Nederland, waar de Groene Voetstappen-campagne wordt georganiseerd door *Klimaatverbond Nederland* en *Vereniging GDO*, gingen kinderen lopend, fietsend, steppend en skatend naar school gedurende een hele schoolweek. Als je de groene voetstappen van de afgelopen twee jaar bij elkaar optelt, zijn de kinderen 2,5 keer om de aarde heen gelopen.

De gemeente Breda had een mooie actie: voor elke 2.500 groene voetstappen, gaf de gemeente één fiets weg aan een kansarm gezin. Aan het einde van de campagne hadden 14 basisscholen in Breda maar liefst 9 fietsen bij elkaar gelopen.



De gemeente besloot dit resultaat te verdubbelen, waardoor 18 fietsen zullen worden verdeeld onder kansarme gezinnen.

Kinderklimaattop 2021

Op 15 april ondertekenden kinderen van verschillende scholen in Nederland het eerste nationale Kinderklimaatackoord. Dit gebeurde tijdens de Kinderklimaattop in gemeente Velsen. Kinderen konden online stemmen welke afspraken zij belangrijk vinden voor een rechtvaardig klimaatbeleid, om verregaande klimaatverandering tegen te gaan en bij het aanpassen op de gevolgen van klimaatverandering. Het zogenoemde "Verdrag van Velsen" werd aangeboden aan Ed Nijpels, voorzitter van het Voortgangsoverleg Klimaatackoord.

De drie belangrijkste afspraken zijn:

- ❖ Duinen ophogen, dijken versterken
- ❖ Minder vlees eten
- ❖ Een boom eruit, twee erin

Italy

The 6,000 little Italian climate protectors together collected in 2020 and 2021 162,977 Miglia Verde (Green Footprints).

Due to Corona the pupils didn't "drive" their pedibus lines as often as in other years but still collected Green Footprints on all their school-days.

In **Formigine** the green and the red BimbiBus lines bring the kids safely to the Carducci, Ferrari and Palmieri School.

In **Sacile** around 300 children are involved and on 21 different pedibus lines walk to the five primary schools from Monday to Saturday.

In **South Tyrol** the kids again in 2020 and 2021 collected their Klimaschritte (climate steps) as part of the European Mobility Week.

In a total children from 36 schools and around 5,500 students took part and together collected 108,252 Klimaschritte or Green Footprints!

The pupils from class 4 M at the Pestalozzi Grundschule in Bozen thought about how they themselves can help to make the world a little bit better. Therefore, under the motto "We protect the earth", they crafted many green Wishprints and recorded their own activities on them. Let's hope that serves as a role model for the climate politicians in Glasgow!

The municipalities Soth Tyrol will participate in the ZOOM Campaign again next year in order to have a lasting influence on the children's habits and to promote a more climate-friendly lifestyle.

Sweden

In 2020 children from 277 schools gathered a total of 585,172 Resepoäng / Green Footprints

In 2021 over 50,000 children from 345 schools participated and did not finish collecting Resepoäng yet

At present, for COP 26 there are 1,341,622 Resepoäng from all over Sweden, collected by 76,155 children

The Swedish participants of the campaign "Ga och cykla till Skolan/Walk and bike to school" joined us again!

The campaign, organized by Trafik Kalendern, wants to inspire pupils, parents and teachers to travel in a smarter and healthier way – simply by walking, cycling and public transport! The goal is to create a greater road safety in the immediate vicinity of children ("för bättre trafiksäkerhet i barnens närmiljö") and to contribute to a better environment, too.

During any two weeks in September and October, the participating schools gather as many respoäng (travel points, divided into "Gröna e Orange Prickar") as possible by using climate-friendly means of transportation in everyday life.

Every year, the activity involves pupils and teachers in grades F-6. In 2021 there were more children participating than ever before. As they can submit their results until 8. November we didn't have their final number when the Climate Conference started. But up to here they already achieved an impressive result!

Besides collecting 'gröna e orange Prickar' some schools could compete with other schools in a municipal competition to win a local price. The winners are awarded with prize money for the school.
